- Learn how Vicente Delgado creates artwork by observing the world around us

What do you see in this artwork?


What materials did the artist use in this artwork?

Hold it and give it a hug!

This is what the artwork feels like – soft and comfy.

WHAT'S THAT ARTWORK?

This artwork is called **We Are Family**. It was made by artist Vicente Delgado in 2014. We Are Family was created by joining different soft toys together. The colourful artwork shows how different groups of people in Singapore live in harmony with one another. The soft toys each have a unique shape, a smiley face and are all connected. They feel like members of a family. The artwork shows how every individual is stronger as part of a community than if he or she were alone.

WHO'S THAT ARTIST?

Vicente Delgado's friends and family call him Tito! Tito used to live in Spain.

He has lived in Singapore for many years now. Observing the people of Singapore, he found that while they were all different, they lived and worked together happily!

DID YOU KNOW?

SHAPE and **COLOUR** are elements of art. There are 7 in total! Look at examples of the elements.

SHAPE







What kind of lines do you see?

For example, lines can be curved, straight, curly or even jagged.

FORM







Are the elements of this artwork close or far away from one another

Comparing the different colours in the artwork, are some lighter than others?

Create a unique artwork made of shapes and colours using your name and birthday!


