## THE VISCOUS SEA

2022


Video, 6 channels, HD format, surround sound, 20 min Collection of the artist Singapore Biennale 2022 Commission

- **MEDIUM**: Videos shot and audio elements collected by the artist during his residency in Jordan.
- TECHNIQUES/PROCESSES: The Viscous Sea is an installation that explores how we experience and are affected by climate change. While Ong plans the content that he hopes to record prior to a shoot, he often encounters unexpected situations and must rely on his intuition while out in the field. As environmental conditions are unpredictable, actively observing and responding to his changing surroundings are key parts of his practice. He has documented the effects of rising sea levels on his treks along the valleys and seasonal rivers that connect to the Dead Sea. He has collected footage of waterways as well as the nomadic Bedouin tribes that roam around the valleys of Jordan. Ong hopes that audiences can derive meaning from what they hear or see.
- IDEAS/INSPIRATIONS/CONTEXT: This installation was developed while Ong was an Artist-in-Residence at The Darat al Funun The Khalid Shoman Foundation. His artwork addresses the impending demise of the Dead Sea and how it affects the larger ecosystem of water networks in Jordan.

## **DID YOU KNOW?**

- 1. The Dead Sea has healing properties due to the high concentration of antiseptic minerals found in its salt and mud.
- 2. You can float easily on the dense, hypersaline water of the Dead Sea.
- 3. The Dead Sea is the lowest point on earth. Its surface is more than 400m below sea level.
