Welcome to the exhibition Sensorium 360°.

Sensorium 360° explores the fascinating and diverse world of the human senses: beyond the commonly known senses of **sight, touch, smell, hearing** and **taste**, even more senses have been identified by scientists. For example, the human body's ability to detect movement is a sense, as is the body's ability to detect pain.

In this exhibition, artists from Southeast Asia and Asia have explored how we experience these diverse senses, and how they make us look at our world differently.

Discussion / Essay Questions:

- 1. If you had to give up one of your senses, which sense would it be and why?
- 2. If you could enhance one of your senses, which would it be and why?
- 3. Do you think pain should be used as punishment? Why or why not?
- 4. Is our society inclusive enough to those with impaired senses? What do you think we could do to make Singapore a more inclusive or considerate society?

DID YOU KNOW?

There have been other human senses identified by scientists besides the traditional five senses, such as the sense of **balance** (equilibrioception), sense of **heat** and **cold** (thermoception), sense of **pain** (nociception), sense of **movement** (kinesthetic sense or proprioception), and even the sense of the passage of **time** (chronoception).
