SINGAPORE ART MUSEUM CELEBRATES SINGAPORE NIGHT FESTIVAL







SINGAPORE, **16 AUGUST 2018** – Festival-goers of the Singapore Night Festival can look forward to an immersive and multi-sensory experience at the Singapore Art Museum over the next two weeks – from free entry to museum exhibitions to outdoor film screenings, music and dance performances, virtual reality playgrounds, SAM x The Local People Art Market, art workshops and even a Harajuku Fashion Walk.

During the festival (17 & 18 August and 23 – 25 August), entry to the museum will be free for all and visitors are invited to explore interactive artworks at *Imaginarium: Into the Space of Time*, go behind-the-scenes at *Installation in Progress: Exhibition-Making and the Singapore Art Museum*, and explore some of the region's best contemporary art at the *Asia Pacific Breweries Foundation Signature Art Prize 2018* sited at venue partner, National Museum of Singapore. Free talks, readings and art workshops will take place around the Singapore Art Museum and at the various exhibitions from 23 to 25 August, allowing festival-goers the chance delve deeper into the themes and ideas explored.

Other highlights of Night Festival at SAM include:

- Aural and visual projection mapping onto the SAM façade | Odyssey by Arnaud Pottier & Thimothée Mironneau (WB Show, France) is a multi-sensory experience involving light, visuals and sound, to be enjoyed daily at the SAM Front Lawn from 17 to 25 August.
- Outdoor screenings of the Back to the Future trilogy and selected films from 15 Shorts | From 23 to 25 August, festival-goers are invited to bring their own mats to enjoy free screenings of the all-time sci-fi classic, Back to the Future, at the 160-yearold SAM courtyards. On 25 August, SAM will be screening selected films from 15



Shorts as well, revealing a lesser-told side of Singaporeans from the 1970s to the 1990s, as part of this project by Singaporean filmmakers, Blue3Asia and the National Volunteer and Philanthropy Centre.

- Comedy, dance and music performances | A range of free performances will be taking place from 23 to 25 August at SAM, SAM at 8Q and at the Basement Galleries of the National Museum of Singapore. They include participative comedy performances by The Annoying Brothers and The Latecomers, hip-hop dance performances by Redeafination (a crew comprising mainly deaf members), soothing instrumentals by various orchestra ensembles, energetic shows by SMU Samba Masala (an Afro-Brazilian percussion group) and SMU INDANCITY (a contemporary dance group), as well as live sessions by musicians SAM Driscoll and NADA (comprising Rizman Putra and Safuan Johari).
- Singapore Art Museum x The Local People Art Market | On 25 August, the well-loved SAM x TLP Art Market returns, featuring live music performances and an array of one-of-a-kind accessories and crafts by local designers, artists and craftsmen.

Other not-to-be-missed activities during Night Festival at SAM include a Diana Mini Lomography Camera giveaway at the *Imaginarium* and *Signature Art Prize* exhibitions, discothemed fitness sessions, a tech playground of virtual reality games for children, and a Harajuku Fashion Walk.
